“The gazebos and the waters – an excellent job!”

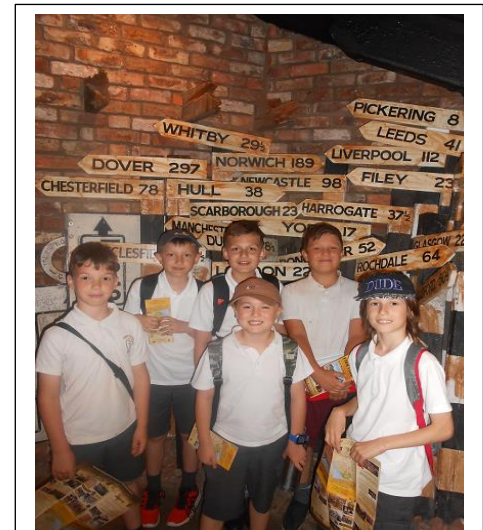
“I thought the organisation for sports day today was Fantastic. Well done to all those involved.”
