The times of the Masses are listed below. Like Easter, the Nativity of the Lord is one of the two solemnities in the Ordinary Form of the Church's liturgical calendar which has its own Octave. The Church regards each day in an Octave as if it were the solemnity itself. So, for example, the prayers for Mass and the Liturgy of the Hours during the Christmas Octave refer to each day as if it were still

Christmas Day. Families are welcome to attend any of the Octave of Masses to celebrate the mystery of Christmas. Please ensure that you book in advance with Fr Neil.



Reporting Positive COVID19 Cases

Schools have been requested by the DfE to continue to track and trace positive case close contacts for 6 days after school closes for the end of term. As you are aware, the last day of term for Christ the King is **Friday 18th December** which means that until **Thursday 24**th **December** we will respond to notifications of positive cases and inform close contacts of the need to isolate.
