COVID 19 Updates

As we have a number of confirmed cases of COVID-19 in Year 5 class, we have taken advice from Public Health England and reformed a 'bubble' for this cohort. The children will continue to participate in all activities but they will not be able to mix with other year groups for a few days. Hopefully, the confirmed numbers will not increase any further and we can relax our control measures again quickly.

If your child displays any symptoms of COVID-19, we would ask that you book them a PCR test immediately and keep them off school until you know the result. Likewise, if NHS England contact you for Track and Trace, you will be obliged to ensure your child takes a PCR test. We will keep you informed of any further developments via Class DOJO.

Read-cycling!

We have been very lucky at Christ the King, to be able to refresh and renew our reading scheme so that it matches the phonics lessons in school. As a result, some of the Oxford Reading Tree Texts (The famous Biff, Chip & Kipper!) are no longer phonetically suitable for our younger children. Mrs Jones is kindly sending the books to charity to support readers across the world. Books2Africa is a UK registered charity that is improving the quality of education in Africa through the provision of books, computers and educational resources that enable individuals and communities to acquire knowledge and achieve their full potential in a globalized world. The charity collects and ships donated educational resources from individuals and organisations in the UK, reducing waste and increasing 'read-cycling'. It is our pleasure to be able to support such an inspirational charity.



Year 1/2 (Kindness Class) Collective Worship
