If parents/carers have costumes from previous years which are no longer needed, please feel free to donate to these to school so we can pass these onto other families.






CAFOD World Gifts

A Message from Father Neil about Sacramental Preparation Years 3 & 4

Father Neil has asked me to remind you that attendance at Mass on Sunday is important. Therefore, he would like to invite you and your family to start attending Mass with your child, if you are not already doing so. Please do not assume that being in Year 3 or Year 4 is an automatic entry for First Reconciliation and Holy Communion, because it is not; commitment is required on your part. The final determination as to whether your child will receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation and Eucharist is left to Father Neil (as the Bishop's advisor), and that decision will be based on whether or not your child has engaged with the programme and is attending Sunday Mass each week.

FIRST CONFESSION: Children in Year 3 and above. Classes begin in February 202

FIRST HOLY COMMUNION Children in Year 4 and above. Classes begin in the Spring term (children must have already made their First Confession in order to join this Class).
